Luke 4:21-30

Like the prophet Jeremiah, Jesus is rejected by those should be able to realise the truth. Both offer the truth and are prepared to suffer for it. The rejection of Jesus here is a foretaste of what is to follow, but he suffers all in love for us. This is just the type of love which Paul calls the greatest of all gifts and the only one that remains.

Dear Friends,

Over the years in this parish I have occasionally asked the members of the community what their vision is of Jesus and what type of person he was. I suspect that it would not surprise many that people's visions are in the same kind of area thinking him as a young man with blue eyes and a beard. In fact the earliest images that we have of Jesus show him as clean-shaven and not with a beard. It will be unlikely, though not impossible, that he will be blue eyed. As to how tall he was we have no way of knowing for sure, but we can speculate. Clearly he was able to read, and read well for although he spoke in the Aramaic language he would read in the Synagogue,




Hebrew, he was Jewish after all. When you read todays Gospel you see that he chose the part of the prophet Isaiah's writing that most directly dealt with him. This is a pivotal moment in his ministry as he is revealing to those who knew him best who he really was. It should be noted that this did not end well with the people trying to throw him down a cliff such was the warmth of his welcome.

The question remains important for us as to what we think of when we call to mind Jesus. It seems to me that whatever we think of the answer to this question will dictate our vision of Christianity and discipleship. Over the years there have been a dizzying number of descriptions of who Jesus really was. Some say he was an itinerant cynic, others a rebel, others a peasant on a mission, others the Messiah and others mixtures of the above. One scholar wrote, in effect, that people find the type of Jesus that they are looking for who is in reality a reflection of who they are. I would like to turn this possibility into something positive in that it means that Jesus can be relevant to many, or even all peoples. If you accept this as the case then we are able to see something wonderful in this person from Nazareth.

Given below is a reconstruction, based on archaeological research, descriptions of people at the time and other sources of someone from Galilee of the time of Jesus. I am not stating that this is what Jesus actually looked like but it is an interesting thought experiment to

reflect on this and thus on the Lord. You will note in this image that Jesus does have a beard and, take my word for it, has dark eyes.

A word of warning needs to be given here as to think of what Jesus looked like and his height is to miss the other important factor of who he is, the son of God. It is important to understand that he is fully human and fully divine, someone who fulfils the prophecy of Isaiah and is the Saviour of all. This union between God and man gives us a redeemer who has lived the fullness of the human condition and saved us all.
