

24th April – Second Sunday of Easter – C

Dear Friends,

The services on Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday form a whole where any one service is incomplete without the others. Each service has the power to move and uplift us, but it is when experienced together that we see the true power.

While I write about power I do not mean it is the normal way of the senses being over-whelmed by some sight or sound. I mean power in a way that our lives can be changed and our emotions heightened. The signs and symbols used during the services may have a different effect on different people, but to me it is the small moments and symbols that often speak to me the most. The simple and direct words used by the Lord at the Last Supper leave a wonderful legacy for us all. Words like 'this is my body', 'this is my blood', 'do this



in remembrance of me' and 'love one another' speak to the centre of our lives. Even when we move on to Good Friday the simple words used belie their deep meaning. Think of the effect of the words of Pilate 'Behold the man' as he brings the bloodied, beaten Jesus out to the mob. It would be hard not to be moved by the words 'it is accomplished' said by the Lord at the very end.

During the Easter vigil I am always moved to see the way the church is changed by the Paschal candle's light being shared with everyone present. Through the sharing of one small flame which is 'divided but undimmed' the darkness is pushed away. This simply, but directly, reminds us of the words in John's Gospel that Jesus is the light of the world, a light that 'the darkness could not hold out against'.

There are many more moments during the service that can have a profound effect on each one of us. To many people the one of the most striking events of the Easter Triduum is the stripping of the altar and sanctuary after the Maundy Thursday service. It follows that when people come along to the Good Friday service there are some adjustments to make and to think about. For example we do not genuflect before going into our seats as the tabernacle is empty of the Blessed Sacrament

I am very aware that many people, even in not COVID times, find the veneration of the Cross a challenging part of the Good Friday service. While I can understand that view I would ask that people should reflect on why we do it. To reflect that we do this because of the death of the Lord Jesus as something that we should remember and give thanks for. This year, of course, people were given the options of bowing before, touching or kissing the Cross. I note that the majority of people chose to kiss the Cross as we had appropriate cleaning in place to make it safe.

For me the Good Friday service is a very moving occasion which always leaves me in a reflective mood. This is added by the fact that the service ends in silence with the church remaining un decorated and bare. It is a time of reflection and thanks for us all. I hope that as many people as possible will come along and share in this act of humility and praise.
